 The Eleventh day of February anno Domini One Thousand seven hundred and ninety four I James Compton of the State & county aforesaid being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be to

God. for the same and Calling to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in form following that is to say Principally & first of all I give and Recommend my soul to God - who give it and my body the dust to be buried in a decent manner at the Discretion of my Executors Nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall Receive it again by the Power of Almighty God - and as for such worldly Goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life. Dispose of in manner following - And first I order and Beadain that all my last debts and Funeral Expenses be first Paid - And secondly I give and bequeath unto my friend Benjamin Smith the one half of all my Land, to be as Equally divided, as can be done, & the other half of my Land I Give and bequeath my friend Jane Campbell also my bed & furniture & my largest Pewter Dish she said Jane Campbell Giving up a ^{that} note she has upon me, to my Executors Canceled, and fourthly I give and bequeath unto Bazel Hallow Senior all my wearing Apparel my ax and mattock & bible and my Saddles and bridles - And Fifthly I give and bequeath unto Charles Wilson my Hough and Tackling and other working tools not before mentioned & all the Remainder of my household Furniture not before mentioned - & Sixthly I order that all my live stock be sold to pay my last debts and also to defray my funeral Expenses -

And if my stock should be Deficient and not
Sufficient to pay my Debts & General Expenses
Then and in that case Benjamin Smith to pay
what shall be wanting from the Sale of my Stock
as before described and Lastly I give and bequeath
to John Wilson Esq. all the Remainder that shall
be if any after the paying of the debts and Gen-
eral Expenses, out of my Stock as aforesaid. &
I do hereby constitute and appoint my loving
Friends John Wilson Esq. & Benjamin Smith
my Lawful Executors, of this my last will
and Testament and do hereby Revoke
and Disannul all Other Executors by me
before named or made, & hereby constitute
said John Wilson Esq. & Benjamin Smith
for my true and Lawful Executors
and I do hereby Disannul & Revoke all other
wills or Testaments, Legacies or Bequests & Executors
by me before this Time Named will be
equated or made, Ordained Ratifying con-
firming this and no other to be my last will
