renew this my Last will and Testament that is to

and for my body I Recommend it to the Earth to be
buried in a decent Christian Manner at the discre-
tion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the
General Resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty power of God, and as Touching
such Worldly Goods wherewith it has pleased God, to
bless my wife in this Life, I give Devise & Dispose
of the same in the following manner to wit
viz It is my will and I do order this in the first
place all my Just debts and funeral Charges to
be paid; & discharged. I give and bequeath to my
Son in law John Hambleton & his wife five Shillings
& I do give and bequeath to my Son in law Jacob
Gillman and Mary his wife five shillings, &
I do give and bequeath to Samuel Wile and wife
five shillings, and I do give and bequeath
to my Grand Child Sam Green Daughter to my
son William Green five Shillings, and Last of all
I do hereby give and Bequeath to my Daughter
Martha all & singular the Lands Messuages
& Tenements together with all the Movable Goods
and Chattels unto me belonging I do hereby

Defallow Rooke and Disannul all & every of my
 former wills and Testaments, before this time, con-
 sidering this and no other to be my last will and
 Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal the day and year above written
