In the Name of God. I, James Simms, Yeoman & Tenant & Trader, being frail and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory, and sound of Judgment as formerly, thanks to God for it, I do therefore make this my last will & Testament in the way and manner following (vizt)
I first bequeath my Soul to the Almighty God, who gave it, & my body to be buried a decent Christian Burial according to the Discretion of my Executors, & after all my Debts and funeral Expenses is paid, I do leave and bequeath unto my three Sisters, Catherine, Jean and Elizabeth, Simms the one third of my Estate to be equally Divided between them. I next I do leave & bequeath to my two Brothers Thomas and Joseph Simms. The Other two thirds of my Estate equally between them, & it to be that any of the above named of my Sisters be

appointed for all men once to die. I do hereby
make my Last will and Testament, in the first
place I commit my soul to almighty God
who gave me my being, and my ~~body~~ body to be bu-
ried in a decent manner; as for the Disposing of my
worldly effects, My mind and will is that first
of all, that all my lawfull debts be paid. Next -
I give to my son John Findley the sum of five
shillings Currency ^{likewise} give to my Daughter Mary
Bowen five Shillings Currency. and to my Dau-
ghter Agnes Moore five Shillings currency. &
to my son Samuel Findley, one Mare and one bed
and to each of my three youngest Daughters
Elizabeth Margaret and Jane Findley (to each
one of them) one cow and one bed. Likewise to my
beloved wife Anna Findley do leave my land &
plantation with the working tools of ^{all} kinds &
all the Horses (and all the Cattle and all the
sheep and all the swine and Hogs during
her life while she remains unmarried
and at her death the said Land and Plantation
our Horses, Cattle, sheep, hogs, & swine
well and Desire is, that my Youngest Son
Alexander Findley shall have all the Land
and Plantation. Horses, Cattle, sheep, hogs & swine
& also all the working tools. I Likewise constitute
