Principally and first of all.

Nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection to obtain an
lasting Happiness in the life to come Thru to the merits & Mer-
itation of my Blessed Redeeming Jesus Christ. and as touching
such worldly estates wherein with it hath pleased God to
bless in this life, I Give, devise & Dispose of the same in Man-
ner and form following (that is to say) - In the first
place I Give and bequeath to Tho. Turner my dear
Beloved Brother one Shilling Sterling of Good and law-
ful money to be raised & levied out of my Estate. Also
I Give & bequeath to Saml George my well beloved Nephew
one pound ten Shillings Sterling also I Give & bequeath
to Agnes Gordon my well beloved Niece one Shilling
Sterling - Also I Give & bequeath to Agnes Young my
well beloved Nephew all and singular my Lands
Mesuages and Tenements my land to be sold at Dis-
cretion of my Executors and the money arising
therefrom full to the use of the said Agnes Young at my
riding horse and saddle with other things unto me belonging
all monies either in my own Possession or in the Posses-
sion of any other person except my wearing apparel
which I will and bequeath unto my well beloved brother
Agnes Young. whom I likewise whom I constitute
make and ordain my only and sole Executor of this
my last will and Testament. - And I do hereby utterly
disallow revoke & disannul all Giving other former Testa-
ments with or Legacies bequeath or Executors by me in any
wise before this time named with or bequeathed ratifying & con-
firming this one & other to be my last will & Testament. In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first above written
Signed sealed & Delivered by the said Tho. Turner, as his last will and Testament in
