In the name of God. amen; I John Pickens being frail & weak of body but of perfect mind and Memory. sound of Judgment do make this my last will and Testament. I first devote my soul to the Almighty God. who gave it and my body, to be buried in a decent Christian Burial according to the direction of my Executors, & that all my just debts being paid & funeral expenses - I bequeath my Negro Girl (named Phillis) and all my Moveable property

to my wife During her life and widow hood. I leave the
geneth to my son Joseph all the land whereon I now live
three hundred and forty four acres with the Mills and
the appurtenances belonging thereto. I leave & Bequeath
to my Daughter Hannah Colver the first child that
I shall have or one hundred Dollars and I likewise be-
queath to my son John when he returns one hundred
Dollars at the expiration of two years from the date -
I leave & Bequeath to my Daughters Eliza & Sarah each
six cows and calves or cattle to that value, each of
them a good riding creature and each of them one Negro
child or one hundred Dollars - and this and no other I
allow to be my last will and Testament. I further al-
low and appoint my wife my son Joseph to be my
whole and sole Executor. All witness whereof I do set
my hand and seal this Twenty second day of Septem-
ber and the year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and ninety five? 1795.

1795. I Jesse Wood of the state of South Carolina County
of Pendleton Farmer being very sick & weak in body

and knowing that it is appointed for all men once
to die do make and ordain this my last will & Testa-
ment. That is to say. First fully and freely of able
I Give & Bequeath my soul into the hands of God.
