In the Name of God Almen, I Robert Pickens of Greenville County St. Bartholomew's parish being  
out of body, but of sound memory, bless be God for it, do this twentieth day of January, in the year of  
our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty three, make and publish this my last will and testa-  
ment, in manner following, that is to say. First of all I give and bequeath to my son Robert Pickens  
shear & constitute make and ordain one of my executors of this my last will and testament, all and singular  
my lands & tenures, and all plantation utensils whatsoever, all the cattle and hogs only what is men-  
tioned underneath. — Secondly I make and constitute Miriam Pickens my other executor, one mare colt  
and two young cows with calf, and three wows, and when she leaves the plantation. — Thirdly I give and  
bequeath to my grandson & granddaughter, John & Martha Pickens one grey mare colt. — Fourthly  
I give and bequeath unto my two grand children, Margaret & Elizabeth Pickens, one black year old  
colt. — Fifthly I give and bequeath unto Oliver Trotter on silver dollar. — Sixthly I give and bequeath  
unto my daughter Jane Norwood, one Cow that I lent him and her increase. — Seventhly I give and  
bequeath to my son Andrew Pickens, one cow and calf if ever he comes here for them. — I do hereby  
utterly disallow revokes, and disannul all and every other testament, wills, legacies, bequests and  
executors by me in any way made, will'd and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this  
and no other to be my last will and testament, whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and  
year above written. — Signed, sealed, published pronounced and declared by the said Robert Pickens as  
his last will and testament in the presence of us, who in his presence and in the presence of each other have  
hereunto subscribed our names.
