Sukey one Negro girl named Betsy and her future increase and my will and desire is that if my daughter Nancy and Betsy or either of them should die without heirs

that the above named Negroes or Negroes shall  
be Equally divided amongst the rest of my Chil-  
dren and my will and desire is that the whole  
Remaining Part of my Estate, the Negroes and  
and Stock of every kind Together with all the  
Plantations, Tools and Household Furniture be  
kept together under the conduct of my other  
named Executors until the youngest of my  
sons comes of age & then the whole Remain-  
ing Part of my Estate in Land and Ne-  
groes and Stock of every and Plantation  
tools and Household Furniture be equally  
divided between my six sons named as fol-  
lows, Aron and Tiahaporo and Spencer and  
Lewis and David & Vincent and that each  
of them have an equal Part of the above mention-  
ed Particulars I do hereby constitute and appoint  
my trusty and beloved Friends Wm. Shelton  
and Tiahaporo Shelton my Executors to this my last  
will and Testament by annulling Revoking making  
void all other wills or wills heretofore by me made  
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand &  
at this eighteenth day of January - 1794
