

THE WILL OF ANDREW LIDDELL

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN, I Andrew Liddell Senior of Pendleton District in the State of South Carolina farmer, do make and declare this my last Will & Testament in manner and form following. First, I resign my soul unto the hands of Almighty God, hoping and believing in a remission of my sins, and by the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ; And my body I commit to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my executor herein after named; And my worldly estates I give and devise as follows.

First, I do give and devise and bequeath to my wife Jane Liddell who calles her name Jenny Liddell, to whom I was married and who lived with me about four years and she then voluntarily left my house bed and boarding and hath not returned any more to me nor been in my house for upwards of Ten Years, and on this account I give her one Cow to her the said Jenny Liddell her heirs and assigns forever.

Secondly, I give and devise to my oldest son John Liddell all that plantation or part of a tract of land whereon he now lives containing one hundred and ten acres joining lands of my own near Andrew Liddell Junior, on the waters of twenty six mile Creek in the District aforesaid.

Thirdly, I give and devise to my son Andrew J. Liddell Esquire all that plantation or part of a tract of land whereon he now lives containing one hundred acres, adjoining the part of the survey on which I now live in the said District.

Fourthly, I give and devise to my son George Liddell all that plantation whereon he now lives containing one hundred acres being part of the same tract whereon Andrew J. Liddell lives in the said District; Also I give and bequeath to my son George Liddell one Negro Girl or female slave named Tabb about thirty five or forty years of age.

Fifthly, I give, devise and bequeath to my son Moses Liddell one dollar to be paid in money to him or his heirs to be paid by my son James L. (S) Liddell --

Sixthly, I give and bequeath to my son Francis Liddell, Thirty Dollars, Twenty Dollars to be paid to him by my son, James Liddell, and Ten Dollars to be paid to him by my son George Liddell in money and those payments are to be made respectively on demand.

Seventhly, I give devise and bequeath to my daughters respectively, namely, Jane Mauldin, the widow of Joab Mauldin, decd., Elizabeth Miller, the wife of John Miller, and Mary McGehee the wife of Willis McGee, each the sum of one Dollar to be paid to them by my Executor in addition to the respective property which I gave them heretofore in my lifetime & which they now have in possession or have disposed of namely one Negro shortly after marriage.

Eightly, I give and bequeath and devise to my son James S. Liddell the plantation whereon I now live containing one hundred acres --

and also I devise and bequeath to my said son James S. Liddell one Negro boy or male slave about four years of age named Jack and one Negro boy or male slave named Jeffry about six months of age, and I hereby give, devise and bequeath to my said son James S. Liddell, all the rest residue and remainder of all my Estates and effects real and personal, whatsoever and wheresoever not herein before otherwise effectually disposed of (after payment of my debts, legacies and funeral expenses and other charges and deductions as aforesaid) to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Ninthly, My will and desire is That the several plantations devised to my sons be held by them their heirs or assigns to the betes and bounds which has been marked be the quantity more or less to them their heirs and assigns To Have and to hold in severalty forever.

Lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my son James S. Liddell or his Executor my sole executor of this my last will and testament Hereby revoking all former or other wills by me made.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty-fifth day of January in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty.
