State of South Carolina Beaufort County - In the name of God amen know all men by these presents, that I Michael Whitmire, being in a low state of health tho^t in my real and perfect senses thanks be to God, for his mercies, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament as follows (viz) my last I recommend to God Who gave it in hopes of meeting with acceptance in that Heavenly Habitation which God hath provided for his people; secondly my body to the grave where it to dust must return again; Thirdly as to my worldly affairs estate, after paying all my just and lawful debts; I do positive will & give unto my son Henry Whitmire, one hundred acres of land, to be laid off the East end of my tract

of land whereon I live, the whole tract containing four hundred and twenty two acres. Originally granted
to Daniel Kelley and conveyed to me, the aforesaid hundred and twenty two acres of land to be laid out by regulation
into lots by the direction of my Executors herein after mentioned, so that it includes a small Plantation
made by John Wright the balance of my land I do give to my two sons Christopher and
William Whitmire; as follows (viz) one half to William Whitmire to include my house and Plan-
tation whereon I live, the balance to Ch^r Whitmire to include my house and Plan-
tation. As they may think most agreeable to this my last will and Testament. Also I give my
son William Whitmire his choice out of my stock of horses to choose one for himself
Also two cows in like manner. also I do ^{positively} order that the balance of my property that
it shall be and remain on my Plantations for the purpose of supporting of my loving
wife Batharine whilst she lives, also she is to have the use of my dwelling house during
her lifetime here and in meantime to have her support for the Stock and ~~Plantation~~ her-
self of my Plantation, and her death the property that then remains (excepting what
I have heretofore in my will for their own) to be equally divided between my sons
and Daughters and Grand-son (to wit) Stephen, Michael, Henry, Samuel,
Christopher and William Whitmire and my Grandson John Whitmire, Bathar-
ine Whitmire and Elizabeth Wright, my Daughters, also I do absolutely
authorize & appoint a Batharine Newnan & William Going to be Executors
of this my last Will & Testament. I M. ^{Signature of} I have hereunto set
my hand and affixed my seal this eighth day of October One thousand seven hundred
and Ninety-five.

In the name of God amen, I John Norris of Rocky River, Pennington County of Washington
District and State of South Carolina being now in full and perfect mind and memory
thanks be to God for the same, and calling to mind the mortality of my body, it is ap-
pointed for all men once to die, do make, ordain and appoint this my last Will and
Testament; in manner and form following, that is to say — I give and bequeath
my Soul into the hands of God who gave it, and my body to the dust (if it shall please God to
call me by Death) to be decently buried at the expense of my Estate, hoping at the resurrec-
tion to receive the purchased reward when soul and body shall be reunited free cor-
ruption and separation no more — I moreover — I will and allow that all
the debts due by me be carefully and honestly paid and the remainder of the estate
wherewith it has pleased God to endow me I give by my last Will and Testament
dispose of in the following manner — I give and bequeath loving wife one Negro
Man named Bob, one Negro Woman named Charle and her horses, two cows & steers, five
steers, one large Barshier and stable, Marshes and lockings her bed & furniture, and the
fourth chair and furniture, one large Walnut chest, four head of sheep one sow pig, her
spinning wheel & her saddle & her one Dutch oven one half dozen of Pewter Plates one half
dozen of plates one large pewter dish & basin, and one tin pan, one set of cups & saucers —
