give it up, and then that it shall devolve & belong to William Brown, Son of
Alexander Brown, — 3rd I will that my beloved wife Hannah Brown
(whom I constitute & appoint to be my executrix) shall peaceably possess all the Negroes
which I am now possessed of, during her life; and at her decease that she shall dis-
pose of them as she sees cause. — 4th I also will that my beloved wife Hannah
Brown shall also possess all my household goods & considerable effects, For other
disallow, revoke & disannul all and every other will or Testament made by me
to be Null, void & of none effect; and that this & no other, be my last will & Tes-
tament made this thirty first day of August Anno Domini, One thousand seven-
hundred and Ninety two and in the seventeenth year of the sovereignty & charis-
doms of the United States of America —

In the name of God Amen. — I, Nathaniel Hall of the County of Pendleton in
South Carolina being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory
thanks be to God, calling unto mine the eternality of my body I do make this my last
will & Testament, that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my
soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave it and in whom I trust I served in my poor
weak way in the preaching of the Gospel from my youth up till now, and my body I recom-
mend to Earth in full and certain assurance of a Glorious Resurrection & eternal life
and Fellowship with my God, Saints, & Angels: And as touching such worldly
Estate wherewith it has pleased God, to bless me with in this life, my will is
first that my body be buried in a Christian decent manner at the discretion
of my executors — Secondly that all my just & lawful debts, shall be paid out,
of my little estate. — Thirdly, that all that estate that was devised to me by John Falkner, as
may be seen on the records in Laurens County office, if ever it is obtained shall be equally
divided among all my children — likewise one Negro woman named Abby & her Daugh-
ter Jinny which is of my own property I give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth, to be hers du-
ring her natural life time and after her decease to be equally divided among all my chil-
dren, and so is my will that none of the above property shall be sold out of the Family —
Likewise my will is, that my lands shall be my beloved wife, during her natural
Life time: except one sovel call known by the name of craps-cott, which I give unto
my son Nathaniel; likewise my will is that if any other boys stay with their Mother
untill they are twenty years of age, then she shall furnish them with a shely young crea-
tures as the stock will afford at that time, also a good country made saddle & bridle, likewise
my will is that all my personal, real & moveable property shall be equally divided among
my children after her decease, — And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke & disannul
all & every other former Testaments, wills, legacies bequeaths &c, by me in any wise before

named, witness & bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to his last will and Testament — and therefore I appoint my Brother Finton & John Hall executors of this my last will and Testament — In Witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of October in the year of Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety three — Signed sealed and published pronounced & delivered by the said Nathaniel Hall as his last will & Testament, in the presence of, whom in his hereunto subscribed our names. }
