

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF WILLIAM DICKSON.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS THAT I, WILLIAM DICKSON, of the State and District aforesaid being weak in body - but of perfect mind and memory calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make ordain and constitute this my last will and testament - that is principally and first of all I recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of - and as touching such worldly estate as it has been pleased God to bless me with in this - I give and dispose of the same in the following manner - I give to my son James Dickson five dollars - I give to son William Dickson five dollars - I give to my son Simpson Dickson five dollars I give to my son John Dickson five dollars I give to my son Robertson Dickson five dollars I give to my son Joseph Dickson five dollars I give to my son Andrew Dickson five dollars I give to my son David Dickson five dollars I give to my Daughter Peggy King five dollars I give to my Daughter Abby Cobb five dollars I give to my Daughter Mary Hughes five dollars I give to my Daughter Liney Dickson five dollars. I also give to my sons Robert and Joseph Dickson all that tract or parcel of land belonging to me to be equally divided between them that lies above the old trail leading from what was formerly called Butts ford on Chauga to the ford on Ramseys just above my plantation. I also give to my sons Andrew and David Dickson the balance of my land to be theirs at the Death or marriage of my wife Polly Dickson. I give to my youngest Daughter Linney Dickson Mills youngest child named Allsberry - the balance of whatever property I may die in possession of. I leave to my wife during her life or widowhood: and at her death or marriage

and all my just Debts paid whatever balance there may be: my will
is that it be equally divided between my three youngest children -
that is Andrew Linney and David - and I do hereby utterly revoke
and disannul all former wills legases bequeaths confirming this and
this only my last will and testament in witness whereof I have here-
unto set my hand and seal this 26th day of June, 1827.
