My last will and testament is that after my debts and burial expenses are paid if there should be any remainder it shall be for the use & benefit of my wife Martha, during her life, after her death, if there should be a child or children of hers & mine it is my desire & will that it shall be used & enjoy the benefit of it, or be divided equally between them if there be more than one. If my wife should die and leave no child nor children to then I wish & will all my mother Elizabeth Holland, at her death I bequeath the whole to my brother, W. T. Holland, & Susanah Doyle & Elizabeth Brewer to be equally divided between them.

I now appoint my brother W. T. Holland the Executor of my will.
