CHARLES DURHAM'S WILL.

The last will and testament of Charles Durham of the State of South Carolina and District of Pickens.

I, Charles Durham considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament and form following.

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Marey Durham one bed and furniture allso one chest and two sheers and one set of plates one dutch oven - Allso I will unto my daughter polley Durham one bed and furniture and bed-stid and allso one cotton wheal and cards and one dutch oven and skillet and allso one red heaffer about two years old and one chest and one set of plates and knives and forks one set. I allso will and bequeath unto my son Jeremiah Durham one tract of land of about one hundred acres joining Daniel Durham and James Langston; I allso will and bequeath unto my son Joseph Durham Bengeeman Durham Charles Durham, juner, all that tract or parcel of land whereon I now live to be equally divided between them three allowing my wife Marey Durham her support on the land during her life or widowhood. Also the rest of my children Lucy Morton Elisabeth Morton patsey gillstrap Delilah gillstrap Nancy Cantrell and rhodah Hendricks, thies my last named daughters I have given them there poutieion of property being worth about twenty five dollars each, allso I will that all the rest of my personal property be scould and all my just debts paid leaving my wife Marey Durham and my Daughter polley Durham a support of the corn and bacon, all<sup>so</sup> I will my big bible and my large hymn book to my wife Marey Durham.

I hereby appoint my beloved Brother Daniel Durham gidian Ellis and Barnett H. Allgood Executors of this my last will and testament heareby revoked all former wills by me maid in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty four.
