Also the rest of my children Lucy Morton Elisabeath Morton patsey gillstrap Delilah gillstrap Hancy Cantrell and rhodah Hendricks, thies my last named daughters I have given them there pourticion of property being worth about twenty five dollars each, allso I will that all the rest of my personal property be sould and all my just debts paid leaving my wife Marey Durham and my Daughter polley Durham a support of the corn and bacon, all I will my big bibbe and my large hymn book to my wife Marey Durham.

I hereby appoint my believed Brother Daniel Durham gidian Ellis and Barnett H. Allgood Executors of this my last will and testament heareby revoken all former wills by me maid in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty four.
