This is my last will and testament. After my funeral & burial expenses & just debts is paid, it's my will and desire is that what little worldly wealth it has been pleased God to bless me with shall be left and distributed in the following manner, by Executors

ITEM 1st. I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Thomas Miller one dollar.

ITEM 2nd. I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter, Catharine Beaty, wife of James Beaty, one dollar.

ITEM 3rd. I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter, Sally Barratt, wife of Reuben Barratt, one dollar.

ITEM 4th. I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter, Elizabeth Robertson, wife of Joseph Roberson, one dollar.

ITEM 5th. I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter, Margaret Fraser, wife of Fingus Hawkins Fraser, one dollar.

ITEM 6th. I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter, Jane Doyal wife of John Doyal, one dollar.

ITEM 7th. I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter, Fanny Denington, wife of Richard Denington, one hundred acres of land, more or less, called the Farley field.

ITEM 8th. I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Polly Miller, one Claybank filly of the old mare.

ITEM 9th. I give and bequeath unto my son Elisha Miller,

ITEM 10th. I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Parker C. Miller, one sorrel filly three years old next spring.

ITEM 11th. I lend unto my beloved wife Jane Miller, in lieu of down, the following property (viz) One Claybank mare about eleven years old; two yoke oxen, one cart, two cows; three yearling stock of sheep & hogs, two feather beds & furniture, all the rest of the household and kitchen furniture, plantation tools, &c one tract of land containing

one acres, adjoining Mrs. Pickens, Starling Gaines, & others, and has
marks & forms as the original plat represents and after her disease
to be sold & the proffits arising from the sale to be equally divided
amongst all the children, now living on land and plantation whereon I
now live, adjoining lands of John McGuarter Crosbys old place & has
such marks and forms as the original plat represents, and after her
disease to be equally divided & the lot valued, Between by son Elisha
A. Miller, Parker C. Miller & Polly Miller (my daughter) &

I do appoint and ordain, to this my last will and testament,
revoking all others, if any; my two sons Elisha Miller & Parker C.
Miller, my sole Executors.
