I, Ambrose Fitzgerald of the State of South Carolina, Pickens District, Being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but wasking body, and calling to mind the uncertainty of life, and being desirous of to dispose/all such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, do make and ordain this my last will in manner following, that is to say -

I desire that immediately after my decease that all my just debts and funeral expences be paid, out of what ready money I now have which is in the hands and safe keeping of Mr. Aaron Terrel, for me, & notes and a receipt for the amount of the same sum of mency/is in the hands of Jesse Jenkins, and after payment of my debts and funeral expences, 80 legive to my son Eli Fitsgerald all the remainder of the money and notes be the same more or less which is described in said receipt as the house-hold ferniture that he has at this time in his possession to him and his helps forever.

And I desire that my tract of land living on Tugeeloc River be said, and an equal dividual of the same between my two sons Ambrose

And I desire that my tract of land living on Tugeeloo River be sold, and an equal dividual of the same between my two sons Ambrose Fitzgerald & Dudley Fitzgerald Provided that the tract of land should not exceed the ambust of two Emidded Dollars - but nevertheless should it exceed the successive Emidded Dollars I give the overplus be the same more or less to my Grandaughter Julity Rowel, as also one feather bed and ferniture - the to them their heirs and assigns forever.

To my Son Garret Fitzgerald I give in addition to what I have heretofore given One Dellar.

To my Daughter Elizabeth Anderson in addition to what she has already had from me I give to her One Dollar.

To my Daughter Anna Rowel also in addition to what I have already given to her I give One Dollar.

I also desire that my mare and cow & calf & the rent of my plantation be sold and also all the ballance of house-hold ferniture which is not before disposed of to be sold and the money paid to them out of the proceeds of the same. alk the balance of said money arising from the sale thereof I desire an equal dividual thereof between my four sons, Viz: Thomas, Ambrose, Dudley and Eli Fitzgerald.

and lastly I do constitute and appoint Cap't David Sloan and my son Eli Fitzgerald executors of this my last will and testament by me heretofore made in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this eighth day of April in the year of our Lord
