IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN:

I, G. W. B. Boggs, of the State and Dis't aforesaid, being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following:

First, all my just debts to be paid.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Eliza K. Boggs the following, to-wit: All my lands and servants stock and farming tools the children all to have a good education. Should my wife die before the expiration of twelve years, the property is to be equally divided among my bodily heirs if practicable if not to sold and the money equally divided at her death. Should she live and marry before the expiration of twelve years the property will be divided at her marriage she receiving an equal portion with each of the children. Should she live and remain single at the end of twelve years the property will be divide she receiving one-third part the remainder being divided equally among my other heirs.

Should any of the property become unprofitable or unmanageable it is to be sold and the money invested in the best way possible for the welfare of my family to be done by consent of both parties (i.e.) my wife & Executor.

Likewise I make, constitute and appoint C. M. Lay to be Executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal the twenty-seventh day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one.
