Pickens County, South Carolina Will Book 1818 to 1863

I, Hugh Ivester, being of sound mind but feeble in body do make this my last will and testament to-wit-

I ask for my body a decent burial my soul I commend to God who gave it.

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Eve all my stock of hogs, cattle sheep horses also all my household and kitchen furniture also all my portion of the crop now on the plantation giving her full charge and control of all the said property for her use and benefit.

I give and bequeath my son Anderson Ten dollars to be paid to him by my wife.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca Ten dollars to be paid to her by my said wife.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Levina Ten dollars to be paid to her by my wife.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Ann Ten dollars to be paid to her by my wife.

I give and bequeath to my son Solomon Young all that plantation tract, piece or parcel of land lying on Cane Creek adjoining of John Fredricks and the tract I now live on which by a deed of Gift I have given to my son Anderson containing One hundred and fifty acres more or less.

And the more fully to carry out this my last will and testament I do make constitute and appoint my friend William S. Grisham my Executor.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this second day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five.
