I James Brewer of the State and District aforesaid being in a low state of health but yet of a sound and strong mind, and knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, also having a mind to dispose of what it has pleased the all Wise to give to me do make and ordain this my last will and testament -

First, I desire that a sufficient amount of my property be sold to pay all my just debts. I then will and bequeath to my beloved wife Elisabeth Brewer all the remainder both real and personal to have and to hold during her natural life or widowhood, in the event she should be married again I desire and direct that the property both real and personal household and kitchen furniture be sold and an equal division made of the proceeds between my wife Elisabeth and children herein named Cornelia Elisabeth, Mary Susanna, Joseph Canniwell, William Taylor.

I further authorize and appoint my wife Elisabeth my lawful Executrix to this my last will and testament, whereof I set my hand and seal this the 8th of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight.
