this the following as my last Will and Testament.

Secondly, to my beloved wife Elizabeth I give and bequeath the
whole of the balance of my real and personal estate for the payment
of my debts and the benefit of her and my heirs by her forever.

Having given to Mariah Knox one negro girl Philis, to Martha Doyle
a negro girl Clara and to Caroline E. Alexander a negro girl Lucy being
all I feel able to give them.

It is my will that my wife apportion to my children by her as she
may think best having full confidence in her discretion. I appoint
my wife Elizabeth my sole Executrix.

thirtieth day of May anno domini one thousand eight hundred and forty
six.
