IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN:

I, James Rogers of the State and District aforesaid, being
in sound mind and memory and wishing to dispose of my property among
my wife, Ann Rogers and my children after my decease after all my debts
and funeral expenses are paid I give to my wife Ann Rogers during her
life time the plantation and tract of land and all lands adjoining to
sd. plantation and tract of land whereon I now live, also I give to
my said wife Ann Rogers a negro woman Lucy and a negro woman Linc and
a negro boy Andy, also all my stock of horses, cattle, sheep & hogs &
fowls, also one wagon & gear all the plantation tools & Blacksmith
tools, also all my ready money and household furniture and kitchen fur-
niture and cooking utensils, and the present crop, and after her death
I want all the remains of my estate to be sold as the law directs and
when all my heirs or their representatives shall render the amount
each one has received make a equal divide among them as the law directs
also all my notes of hand and debts due me I give to my wife Ann Rogers
to collect for her use. Also I give to my daughter Margaret Rogers
one mulatto or negro girl Holley for the use of her and her heirs for-
ever.

I acknowledge this to be my last will and testament.
