KNOW ALL MEN WHOM IT MAY CONCERN that I, James Sanders of Pickens District and State of South Carolina, being now of sound mind and memory to uncertainty of life, and considering the duty I owe to my beloved wife Eunice Sanders, do hereby grant her the privilege in case she out lives me of renting the plantation whereon I now live, and also whereon my sons A. J. and Lewis A. Sanders now live, and of keeping the proceeds thereof for her own use and benefit during her natural life, and also I grant her the privilege of retaining all the farming utensils, stock of hogs, cattle, horses, including all the property now in my possession during her natural life, in order that the farm may be carried on to her benefit, as it has been heretofore.
