I, Jeremiah B. Mowhorter, being of sound and disposing mind but weak in body and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner following, that is to say -

1st. I will my soul to God who giveth.

2nd. That I desire that one Bay mare be sold and my just debts and funeral expenses be paid.

3rd. I will and bequeath to my wife Jane all my estate both real and personal during her natural life or widowhood, if she marries then the property to be sold both real and personal and divided between my children Margaret Ann Elizabeth Sarah Jane Rebecker Martha Mariah Charlotte Letticha, and all the rest of my estate both real and personal of what nature or quantity whatsoever it may be not herebefore particularly disposed of I desire may be equally divided amongst my several children hereinbefore named I give the same to them their heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever.

And lastly I do constitute and appoint my said wife Executor of this my last will and testament by me heretofore made in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the 13th of February 1844.
