IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN:

I, Jeremiah Roberson, being a man of sound mind and memory and considering the frailty of this transient life do make and establish this my last will and testament revoking all wills heretofore made by me.

It is my will that my property both real and personal shall be disposed of as follows:

ITEM I. It is my will that all my property both real and personal (with the exception of a tract of land hereafter to be disposed of) remain in the hands of my wife and mother for the benefit of my wife Martha or during my wife's widowhood at the death of my mother it is my will that all my property be kept together both real and personal for the benefit of my wife Martha and my children. It is my will that all the property that is on the homestead as it now is together with all my interest during the natural life of my mother Catharine Roberson. It is my will that all my effects should then remain in the hands of my wife during her widowhood or natural life for the equal benefit of my wife and children. In case my wife should marry it is my will that all my property both real and personal not otherwise disposed of be equally divided between my wife Martha and my children, my wife to have a child's part.

It is my will that in case any of my children should become grown and go off to themselves or marry, it is my will that they should have such portion of my property as the Exeters think proper at that time by valuation but no final division of my effects to be made until the death or marriage of my wife Martha, then it is to be equally divided between my wife, in case of marriage, and children, by sail or other wise, as thou best by my Exeters. It is my will that the tract of land that is unimproved and owned by me separately shall be sold by my Exeters and the money applied to my

lawful deats.

I appoint A. J. Anderson, Alvy Griffen Exeters and Marthy Roberson Exets. as my lawful Exeters and Exetrix and empower them to dispose of all my effects according to this my last will and testament.
