

OR GOD, AMEN.

I, John Cobb, of Pickens District, having lived to an advanced age knowing it is appointed for man once to die - and not knowing no soon or how suddenly I may be called - and being now of sound mind, memory and understanding, and desiring that after my departure no confusion may take place or controversy about the world's estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me, and

1st. It is my will and desire that all my just debts (if any) do be paid as soon as possible after my decease.

2d. I will, give, devise and bequeath all my estates real and personal of every kind and description to my beloved wife Frankey Cobb, during her natural life, to have, hold, use, possess and enjoy the same, and to sell such cattle, horses, hogs, &c., as she may think best to use the proceeds to her support during her natural life without any charge of waste; My dear bosom companion has been to me a help, not indeed and my desire is that she enjoy as much of property as she may desire - And to her the whole sole control & management is committed during her natural life.

3d. At the death of my wife it is my will and desire and I so direct my Executors hereinafter named, to sell at public auction all personal estates to the highest bidder - at such time or times and on such credit as to them shall seem expedient. And when collected to divide the proceeds among all my children, sons and daughters, who may be living at the time of my death.

4ly. I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint Joseph Richam, A. C. Cobb to execute this my last will and testament and do hereby revoke all other wills by me made.
