For the disposal of such worldly estate as it hath pleas God to bless me with, I, John Maret of the State and District aforesaid do make and ordain this my last will and Testament.

I will and bequeath unto my wife Francis Maret all the propperty of which possessed at my death both reall and personal duerin hear Afetime or widderhood, at her death or marriage every thinge that mabe wisescad by hear be solde and equaly divid among my nine children bein seven sons and two dauters. it is further my will that my son Robbert W. Maret have a bead and furnature and a desk and four dollar and fifty cents paide to him when caul for, alsi I will to him my littel shot gun. it is also my will that my two dauters Beetha A. Maret and Matilda A. Maret have paid to them when called for fifteen dollars a peace by the king it bin in vume of propperty given off to the other children. the property above mentioned to my son Robbert Marret is in vume of propperty which has been given off to the other children. it is further my will that as long as my two dauters remains wit my wife Francis Maret that the ma be provided for as one of the family it is allso my will that at any time their are any propperty on the place that is not needed such propperty to be solde and taken car of til my wife Francis Marets death and then be equally divided among the the children als if their shold be any propperty needs on the place it to be bought and paid for out of the estate. No propperty to be bought or solde only by the concent of the Executors x it is further my will that at the death of my wife that my two dauters Rutha A. Mare and Matilda A. Maret have a bed and furnature x given to them more than the other children a peace.

I appoint my sons George W. Maret, William M. Maret and Robert W. Maret my Executors of this my last Will and Testament this the 5th day of November one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one.
