Thirdly, I desire that my stock of cattle and hoge all be sold and all my just debts be paid out of the proceeds of the same the if that should not be sufficient to meet all the just demands I wish my Executor to sell my two feather beds and furniture and my bureau and if that should not be sufficient to meet the just demands I wish him also to sell my double barrel shot gun appurtteses thereunto belonging though if there should a sufficiency to satisfy all the demands without selling my shot gun I give and bequeath hit and all the appurtteses to my much esteemed brother-in-law George R. Hunter for his own use and benefit.

Fourthly and lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved brother John E. Lodon Executor of this my last will and testament.
