IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN:

I, Leonard Capehart of the District and State aforesaid, being in usual health and of sound mind and disposing memory, and knowing the certainty of death, do make this my last will and testament, viz,

First. I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah all her wearing apparel, the bed and furniture which she had when I married her, and all other property of every description which she may have had when I married her.

Second. I will and bequeath that after my death, all my property of every description, (except that heretofore and above disposed of) be sold by my Executors hereinafter named, at public or private sale, at their discretion, and the proceeds applied first to the payment of all my just debts and the remainder, if any, divided as follows, viz,

Third. I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah, one-third part of the remainder of my estate after the payment of my debts as above directed, to have and use during her natural life, for her support, and after her death to be given under the direction of my said Executors to my daughter Elizabeth Eveline Capehart.

Fourth. I will and bequeath that the remaining two-thirds of my estate be equally divided between my son Harvey, one-fifth part, the lawful heirs of my son John one-fifth part to be between them equally divided, my son Samuel one-fifth part, and the children of my daughter Nancy who was married to James Rogers and is dead, viz, Leonard, James, Diver, John and Nathan Rogers, one-fifth part to be divided equally between them, and to my daughter-in-law Mary Ann Capehart (the widow of my son B. W. F. Capehart) and her son Hamilton Brevard the remaining fifth part to be between the two equally divided.

Fifth. I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Col. Jephtha Norton, Capt. Levi N. Robins, and Miles M. Norton my Executors to

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carry into effect this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning thereof, hereby revoking all other wills made by me.
