I also leave one mare colt to John Barin provided he stays out his time until he becomes twentyone years of age if he goes away before that time he don't get her. I wish one sorrel horse one wagon and hind gear and my stock of sheep to be sold the wagon that I got from John Stephens I leave for the use of my wife on the plantation the wood work of the one horse wagon from Stephens to be sold and Stephens to be paid five dollars out of the price the woodwork of a four horse to come from James Langston to be sold.

I also leave the above named childing Enoch excepted five dollars in cash in addition to what the have already received.

I hereby appoint James Langston Executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

In wt. whereof I hereby set my hand and seal the twenty second day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six.
