I, Lindamira Lewis, do make ordain and publish this as my last will and testament, that is to say, I will and bequeath to my nephew Joseph McDowell my negro boy named Ben. To Mira Elizabeth McDowell I will and bequeath one negro girl named Rose. To Edward Henry Shanklin I will and bequeath one small negro boy named John. To Mira Elizabeth McDowell I further give and bequeath one bedstead and chest of drawers. All the residue of my negroes together with all my lands which I have in possession or which may fall to me on a final partition of my father's estate I devise will and bequeath to my brother John E. Lewis and James Overton Lewis to be divided equally between them.

I hereby nominate constitute and appoint my said brother John E. Lewis and James Overton Lewis Executors of this my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this thirtieth day of May A. D. 1834.
