ITEM 1st. I hereby will and bequeath all the property both real and personal, and cash, of which I may die possessed, or may be entitled to, from any and every source whatever, to my two daughters, viz, Rhuhama, who intermarried with Barnet Neighbors, now deceased, and Matilda who intermarried with John Garner, to be divided equally between them share and share alike by my Executors hereafter named, at my death.

ITEM 2nd. In case of the death of either or both of the above named Rhuhama and Matilda, I will and bequeath the share or shares which she or they would have been entitled to at my death to the legal heirs of her or their bodies, to be equally divided between said heirs share and share alike by my Executor.

ITEM 3rd. I hereby appoint John T. Sloan of Pendleton Village my Executor of this my last will and testament, and charge him with the faithful execution of the same.
