I Nathaniel Gordor of the State and Disat aforesaid calling to mind the uncertainty of life do make and ordain this my last will and testament as follows, to-wit.

In the first place I will and bequeath to my grand daughter Sarah Canter Gordon one Beaureau looking glass table and two chairs will to my grand daughter Louisa Gordon one table one bead and bead-clothing two chears my will is after my death the negro woman called Betty to be sold on twelve month credit the money arriveing from the sale of the said negro to distribution as follows fifty dollars to each of my grand sons Marian Gordon and William Jefferson Gordon sons of A. W. Gordon, if anything more I give to my daughter-in-law Treasey Gordon of the sale of said negro my furniture for kitchen use such as pots and earthenware I leave in the care of my daughter-in-law Treasey Gordon to give to her two daughters called Sarah and Louisa when they need the same. N.B. If it be lawial for me to give anything to my girl Betty my will and desire is that there should be of the money arriving from the sale of said negro Betty Fifty dollars placed in the hands of Reuben Coleman, Sen'r, for the use of said negro by the said Coleman being paid out of that amount for his trouble. All of my other property has heretofore been disposed of not willed all of my former will heretofore made and signed are of nonefect and this to be my last will and testament and last of all I appoint Reuben Coleman, Sen'r my lawful exo'or of to execute this my will in testimony I hereoff set my hand and affix my seal this 23rd of April 1842. After funeral expence paid what cash in hands I give to my daughter-in-law Treasey.
