

I, Sidney S. Isbell being severely afflicted with a dangerous disease & having all my natural senses & being aware of the uncertainty of my life, do declare this day made and do declare this to be my last will and testament as follows:

1st. After paying all my just debts it is my will and desire that all the remainder of my Est. be left to my wife and children for their mutual benefit.

2nd. It is my will and desire that the tract of land be kept & that my wife & children live thereon until my children become of age and then to be sold & divided equally between my wife & children all to share & share alike.

3rd. It is my will and desire in case of the marriage of my wife again that everything be sold and an equal division be made between her and my lawful children. The children to have guardians appointed or if old enough to choose for themselves such guardians to take charge of their portion until they become of age.

4th. I hereby appoint my brother Wm. Isbell my Executor & give him full power to act & carry out the above as fully as if I were myself alive & able to act for myself.
