The ballance of my propperty I will to my children as hearin after mention. I will and bequeath to my Daughter Charlotte Hays one feather bed and furniture all the kitchen furniture one cow and calf and twelve head of hogs. I will and bequeath to my Daughter Harry Massingill one hundred acres of land off the lower end of my tractk of land whereon I now live during her lifetime and after her death to belong to her son Bengamin Hays, also to the said Daughter Mary five dollars in cash. I will and bequeath to my son Solomon Hays one hundred acres of land whereon he now lives also one feather bed and small waggon. I will and bequeath to Mary Elizabeth Hays the daughter of Bengamin Hays one heiffer yearling. I will and bequeath all the ballance of my property to Solomon and Bengamin Hays. I also appoint Solomon and Bengamin Hays my Executors to carry this my last will and testament into effect. April 30th, 1852.
