IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN:

I, Tally D. Burdine of S. D. State and District being of a sound and disposing mind and memory and calling to mind the certainty of death and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I do make and ordain this my last will and testament in the manner following that is to say I desire that after my decease all my just debts and expences be paid. I also will and devise to my loving wife Martha Burdine my real estate where I now live it being three hundred and twenty acres more or less lying on Georges Creek waters of Saluda River. I also will and devise to my loving wife Martha Burdine all my Stock of Cattle and hogs and household furniture and everything that I own to the S. D. Martha Burdine during her natural life or widowhood when either of these takes place then to belong to my daughter Mary Jane and if there is any other lawful heir it is to have an equal part with Mary Jane. I also will and devise if this child or children dies before they are capable of receiving there estate so there is no lawful heir of mine left I also will and devise that Tally a son of James Burdine is to have one hundred dollars also John Tally a son of James MeAdams is to have fifty dollars. I also will and devise the balance to be equally divided between my two brothers James and Mason Burdine also my three sisters Sally Satterfield Polly Hunt and Nancy MeAdams. I also desire that Mason Burdine be my executor and Martha Burdine my wife as witness hereunto I set my hand and seal this thirteenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine.
