IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN:

I, Thomas Alexander, of the State and District aforesaid,
being of sound and disposed mind and memory but weake in body and
callin to mind the uncerity of life and being desirous to dispose of
all shuch worly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, do
make and ordain this my last will in memory following, that is to
say, I desire after my deeth that all my just debts should be paid
out of the first money that should arrise into the hands of my Execu-
tors hereafter to be appointed.

First, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Alexander
the place known as the William Murphree place. She is to pay there
abre towards said land which is knot none give that part to doe as
she pleases with, and the balance to come out of my estate. She has
that parte here lifetime and at here deeth to goo to my lawful children
equal the part she has is here share of here first husband Mr. Mar-
phree.

Secondly, I give out of the crop of corne and meat what will
be a support for her my wife Mary Alexander.

3. To take all with her she fetch here with her as here own
and is not to have any part of my estate that I had before I mared
her Mary Murphree.

4. I give to my daughter Deannah Alexander the place I now
live on to doe as she pleases as long as she lives single to have in
full power and when mared or dies to be sold and equal divided among
my lawful heirs and after she take her property and the balance is to
be sold and equal devvided among my lawful heirs the parte I mean is
two cattle and one colt and bed and furniture and I want it understod
that Deannah Alexander is to have not is made on the place as long as
she stay aingle I mean in my will for that property belong to me be-
fore mared to goo to my children and what she had to be born to doe
as she pleases with and what is considered a support of corne and meat

for one year.

And lastly I do constitute and appoint Daniel Alexander, Joshua Holden and William Hurd my first Executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the twenty-ninth day of September, 1856.
