I, Thomas Lively, Sen'r, of said District Being of sound mind & memory, but weak in body & calling to mind the uncertainty of life & being desirous to dispose all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, do make & ordain this my last will in the manner following, that is to say I give unto my beloved wife Rachel Lively alife time estate in all that I do possess and after her death I desire that my daughter Jane Lively & my grandson Mark Lively have all my stock of horses cattle & hogs & sheep and household & citchen furniture plantation tools of every description and everything that I do possess in the world to be equally divided between them and in case that either my daughter Jane Lively or my grandson Mark Lively dies without issue then the whole of my property falls to the other Except my lands or plantation which I give to my son John Lively the west side that is from a Black oak corner near Stewarts Creek on the southwest side thence a straight line to a rock corner on Robt. McCanns line by an old field and the east side I do give unto my daughter Jane Lively Mark Lively as the above property after my wife's death Rachel Lively & to each and every other legal heir of mine I give and bequeath Ten shillings sterling & do ordain and appoint my son John Lively my Executor to carry this my will into effect.

In testimony whereof I have unto set my hand & affixed my seal this Eighth day of May - in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & thirty six and in the sixtieth year of the Independence of the United States of America.
