I, Thomas William Carne of the State and District aforesaid, Being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but weak in body, and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, do make and ordain this my will in manner following, (having already disposed of all of the rest of my estate to my beloved children) that is to say, I give unto my wife Elisabeth Carne my plantation on which I live in the State & District aforesaid on waters of Cane Creek my three ~~sons~~ slaves, my man slave Jack my woman slave Betty and my boy slave William, also my stock of cattle and hogs together with my household furniture and furthermore, all the interest of two notes which I hold one of a certain amount on Benson and Sloan, one on Benjamin David Dupre of five hundred and fifty dollars the one on Benson and Sloan aforesaid of one hundred dollars to have and to hold for her comfort and support during the time of her natural life and after her death to be divided among my children equally.

And lastly I do constitute and appoint my wife Elisabeth Carne Executrix of this my last Will and Testament by me heretofore made.
