toe towit five hundred and four acres and I further will to my be-
loved son William Winchester oute of the profets of the said land
a handson suporte during his natur'l life and if the s'd Joseph and
Elizabeth faile to comply with the same then the land to be convirt-
ed to such a use as shall support the s'd William Winchester with
all the rest of my porsonal estate and after a reasonable charge
paid for ther trouble with ther Brother the balance of the estate
to be equally divided amongst my children and I further will that
my beloved son Joseph Winchester shall be my executor to transact
my will in witness whereof I heare unto set my hand and fix my seale
this twentyeth day of July and in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and forty three and in the sixty seventh yeare of the
Independence of the United States of America.
