I, William Day, of Pickens District and State of South Carolina
beeing of sound and disposing mind and memory but weak in body and
calling to mind the uncertainty of life and being desirous to dispose
of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with
Do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner following,
that is to say:

First, I desire to commit my soul to God who gave it and by body
to the earth from whence it came to be decently buried.

Secondly, I desire that all my just debts and funeral expences
be paid and

Thirdly, I desire that my beloved son Reuben Day be paid for his
trouble and expences with me during my sickness, and I do hereby ap-
point Aaron Moore Samuel Brown and Levi Cox to say and determine what
Reuben shall have for his trouble and

Fourthly, I desire that my property shall be sold and equally
divided between my legatees namely Reuben Day Lewis Day Francis Bratcher
and William Day and Nancy his wife Williams part to be equally divided
between himself and wife.

And lastly I do constitute my son Reuben Day Executor of this my
last will and testament by me heretofore made.
