The 22 day of March 1792.

Howell of Richland County and State of South Carolina being very sick in body but in my perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the mertality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will and testament in memory and form following First I do will that my insuing crop of Indigo be sold and such of my stock of my cattles— my Emils shall those proper that this memory arising from such sales and what of my debts can be collected be applied howards the discharge of this debts I owe and in case the sales shuld not be sufficient to pay my debts then I do will that my Tymas of Land townshing on pen branch be by my Exr's sold and the money arising from the sales thereby applied towards the discharge of my debts and that my Exr's do Emoute titles for call lands

I do will that in ease my debts can be paid as afore mentioned Evolutive of the sale of the tase I then and in that case I do will am requests the said Type of land to my Son John together with the Frank of Land on which I now live and I do lend unto my well beloved wife one Equal Dividend with my children at all my personal property during her life and at her death it is to be equally divided amongst my children and I do will and bequeath that my personal! Property be Equally divided amongst my children as the coverably our of age or marry and I do will that my small children be decently educated at the description of my Eur's hareafter named --

And I to nominate - Constitute and appoint my beloved Smallners william and Martina Hewell and my well Delayed Garin, Joseph Deniel Martin of this my last will and Testament Signed scaled in the presents of-- Arthur Howell Rob't Hewell John Howell
