ARTHUR HOWELL

The 22 day of March 1792-

In the Name of God Amen I Arthur

Howell of Richland County and State of South Carolina being very sick in body but in my perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following First I do will that my insuing crop of Indigo be sold and such of my stock of my catche ~~as my Exr's shall think proper~~ that this money arising from such sales and what of my debts can be collected be applied towards the discharge of these debts I owe and in case the sales shu'd not be sufficient to pay my debts then I do will that my Tract of Land touching on ^{Pan Branch} be by my Exr's sold and the money arising from the sales thereby applied towards the discharge of my debts and that my Exr's do Execute titles for said Lands -----

I do will that in case my debts can be paid as afore mentioned Exclusive of the sale of the land I then and in that case I do will and bequeath the said Tract of land to my Son John together with the Tract of land on which I now live and I do lend unto my well beloved wife one Equal Dividend with my children of all my personal property during her life and at her death it is to be equally divided amongst my children and I do will and bequeath that my personall Property be Equally divided amongst my children as the ^{severally} sum of age or marry and I do will that my small children be decently educated at the discretion of my Exr's hereafter named --

And I do nominate - Constitute and appoint my beloved ~~Executors~~ William and Martha Howell and my well beloved ~~Cousin~~ Joseph Daniel Exr's of this my last will and Testament Signed sealed in the presents of-- Arthur Howell
