STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA.***

In the Name of God Amen. I John Belton of the County of Richland Surveyor, Bieng in Health of Body and of perfect Mind and Memory, thanks be given to God calling unto Mind the Mortality of my Body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say, first of all I give my Soul into the hand of Almighty God that giveth it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth, to be Buried in decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give, devise and dispose of in the following Manner and Form.

First I desire that all my just Debts be paid by my Executors hereafter Named, Secondly that my Waggon and three mules and gray horse be kept for the use of my plantation, With as many of the plantation tools as my Executors shall think necessary for working the same Thirdly I give Bequeath unto my three youngest Children, that is to my Daughter Martha Belton Christine Belton and my Son James English Belton to be Equally divided Between them, all my stock of the Cattle and all the Stere or the Cattle to be for the use of the whole of my Family, and that my Bay mare Called Cate shall be kept to breed for my three youngest Children Viz Martha Christine and my Son James E. Belton and that all her increase shall be Equally divided Between them and no division Be made of her increase till my Son James E. Belton Arrive to the age of ten years the Lord permitting him to live till then, Fourthly, I desire that my three eldest daughters have the Mare fillys goes under their Names Exclusive of their Equal Dividdd of the remaining part of my Estate.

Fifthly, I desire that the remaining part of my Estate Both real and personal be Equally Dividdd Between my

Seven Children, Vis: Mary Belton Ann Belton Rebecca Belton Elizabeth Belton Martha Belton Christine Belton and James English Belton, share and share alike, and if any of the above Children should die unmarried, or before they come of age that thier part of the Estate shall and be Equally divided amongst the surviving Children share and share alike, and I do further desire of my Executors that no Division be made Between Children till the full sum or whole year be arrived, or till as my Executors shall think it Best for the benefit of my Children. And Lastly I do hereby appoint and constitute My Will a beloved Brother Abraham Belton and my Brotherinlaw Joshua English and my Friend John Milhouse Jun'r to be the Executors of this my last will and Testament, and that they shall have full power and shall be lawfull for them, to sell any part or the whole of my Real Estate of Land, any part of them excepting one quarter of an acre of ground where my Son John Belton is Buried, which Plot or Parcel of ground shall be for Ever Kept for the Use of a burying place for any of the family that shall think proper to be interred there, Excepting the Bodies of such as should be Buried there should be removed to Camden and there Buried in the graveyard amongst thier friends, and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Testament Wills Legacies Requests and Executors by me in any ways before named Willed and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament In witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Seventh day of February in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety and in the Fourteenth Year of the American Independence.
