BENJAMIN FREEMAN

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN I Benjamin Freeman being sick of body, but of perfect mind and memory, and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, do make constitute and ordain this to be my last will and Testament 1st. It is my desire that my Executors hereafter named shall sell all my Estate both Real and personal and after paying my Just debts out of the proceeds thereof I devise the ballance to be equally divided between John Marlow and Sarah Hathcock to them and their heirs forever. And Lastly I appoint my friend John Hopkins my Lawfull Executor to Execute this my Last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this Eight day of October 1823
