and State aforesaid do make and ordain this my last will and
testament, hereby revoking any and all will or wills by me
at any time heretofore made. Item 1st. I desire all my just
debts to be paid and I direct the proceeds of my crops to be
appropriated to that purpose; Also the following Real Estate,
which I hereby Empower and direct my Executors(to be here-
inafter named) to sell at public or private sale as they may
deem best viz: That part of the Grub Field Plantation (in-
cluding the Mill and Mill Tract on Rocky Branch, and all the
land lying North of the Mill Pond) which lies North of Granby
Lane or the Road to Granby Ferry, including also all the
Town Lots and Street conveyed to me by the Superintendent of
Public Works: that is to say up to William G. Hunts farm
and the Estate of Mrs. Sarah Taylors Land on the side west
to the Town of Columbia, Also all my land situated within
the corporate limits of the Town of Columbia, and the imme-
diate vicinity. Except two Acres on which the old House
stands where my father the late Col. Thomas Taylor resided
in his life time Also Except two acres more around the family
and Negro burying ground. If the proceeds of the sales of
of the said real Estate and Crops be not sufficient to pay
my debts, then I authorize and direct my said Executors to
sell either at public or private sale, for the purpose of
paying said debts, my White Acre Plantation, bought by me
from Col. John S. Preston and containing about one thousand
acres. Item 2nd. To my son Thomas Taylor I give the old House
place in the Town of Columbia, containing two acres, as above
reserved Also the two acres reserved around the burying ground
in fee simple forever. I also give devise and bequeath unto my
said son Thomas Taylor in fee simple for ever, McGraw, Collins
and Cobb Tracts of Land bequeathed to me by my father the late
Colonel Thomas Taylor in his last will and testament:
Also that part of the Manigault Land,

embraced in a straight line, commencing on the River, at
the dividing corner between the land bequeathed to me
by my father and the Manigault Land, and running on the
old line to the outside of the swamp, from thence upon
the margin of the swamp to Poplar Branch where it Enters
into the swamp, and from thence to the South Carolina
Hall Road.

Item 3. To my son Benjamin Walter Taylor I give, devise
and bequeath in fee Simple for Ever, the Manigault Plantation
(Excluding the part above devised to my son Thomas
Taylor) Also the Tract of Land I purchased of James M.
Daniels South of Rocky Branch. Also that part of the
Crab Field Plantation which lies South of Granby Lane.

Item 4th. I will and direct that the Land above devised
to my sons Thomas Taylor, and Benjamin Walter Taylor be
valued by disinterested persons to be selected by my Ex-
ecutors(to be hereinafter appointed) and the appraised
value of the whole divided into five Equal parts or shares:
and I will and direct that my said Sons Thomas Taylor and
Benjamin Walter Taylor pay over to their three sisters
three of said Shares: viz one of said Shares or fifth
parts to Virginia Green, wife of Halcoot P. Green; one of
said Shares or fifth parts to Nannie W. Mazyck wife of
William St. J. Mazyck: and one of said Shares or fifth
parts to Sally Coles Taylor.

Item 5th. To my wife Sally W. Taylor, I give, devise and
bequeath in fee Simple for Ever, my residence called Edge
Hill, and the four hundred Acres of Land thereunto attached.
I also give and bequeath unto my said wife the following
Slaves viz: Lewis and Eliza, Sam and Betty and their Child-
ren(except Marian a negro girl heretofore given to Mrs
Mazyck. Also all my household and kitchen furniture and
my horses and carriage. I also will and desire that my said
wife Sally W. Taylor be amply supported out of my Estate, in

the manner and style in which she has been accustomed to live and to have the use of the house servants during the term of her natural life, and I hereby direct my said sons Thomas Taylor and Benjamin Walter Taylor to make ample provision out of my Estate for the support of my said wife and her household during the term of her natural life.

Item 6th. I will and direct that all my negroes (Except those herein specifically bequeathed) be divided Equally among my five Children Thomas Taylor, Benjamin Walter Taylor, Virginia Green wife of Heicot P. Green, Nannie W. Mazyck wife of W. St. J. Mazyck, and Sally Coles Taylor, to them and their heirs for ever.

Item 8th. To my son Thomas Taylor I give and bequeath the following slaves and their increase viz: Billy Smart, Holland (the Tailor) and Sancho.

Item 8th. To my son Benjamin Walter Taylor I give and bequeath the following slaves and their increase viz: Carpenter Prince, Hannah his wife, and their children (Except Jenney) also Eve and William James Phoebe and John Children of Hannah Thompson.

Item 9th. To my daughter Nannie W. Mazyck I give and bequeath the following slaves and their increase viz: July (brother of Eve) and Jenney and her two children.

Item 11th. In making the division of my negroes among my children under the Sixth Clause of this my last will and testament, I desire that the negroes herein specifically bequeathed to my said children, and also any negroes heretofore advanced by me to either of my said children at any time, be valued and taken into the Estimate in making said division, so as to make an Equal and Equitable partition of the whole.

Item 12th. I will and desire that the shares of my Estate both real and personal herein given and devised to my surviving husband respectively and

the share of Sally Coles Taylor be held by my said Executors until the said Sally Coles shall marry, and after her marriage by her husband, in trust for the sole and separate use of my said daughter respectively and not subject to the debts, contracts or liabilities of the present or any future husband of my said daughters, for and during the terms of their natural lives respectively, and after their respective deaths then in trust for such child or children, as my said daughters may respectively leave living at the time of their death, share and share alike and in fee simple for ever: The child or children of a deceased child taking the share its or their parent would have been Entitled to if living. And in case either of my said daughters should die without leaving a child or children or the child or children of a deceased child living at the time of her death, then her share of said Estate to be divided among her next of kin and distributees, according to the Statute of Distribution of this State.

Item 13th. In the division of my negroes among my children as above provided I desire that as far as practicable, families be kept, and that old and infirm negroes be permitted to go with their families and be kindly treated.

Item 14th. Any of the Estate of which I may die possessed not herein before devised and bequeathed, and any surplus which may remain of the proceeds of my lands which I have directed to be sold for the payment of my debts, after the payment of said debts, I will and desire to be Equally divided among my five children share and share alike, in fee simple for ever.

Item 15th. Lastly, I nominate constitute and appoint my two Sons Thomas Taylor, and Benjamin Walter Taylor Executors of this my last will and testament. I also nominate constitute and appoint my friend John T. Goodwyn one of the Executors of this my last will and testament.
