Carolina, Planter, being Infirm by Age, and Bodily Complaints, but of Sound mind and Memory, And knowing it is appointed for all Men to die, and after Death to Judgement, Do Constitute and appoint this as my Last Will and Testament -

First, I give my Body to the Dust from whence it came, and my Soul, tho' Polluted With many Sins, into the Hands of my beloved Saviour, not doubting but he will raise it up at the last day to a Blessed immortality - As Touching those things which it has Pleased GOD in this Temporal life to Bless me with, I give and Bequeath in the following manner (after my Just Debts are paid) Item, I give and Bequeath, to my Beloved Wife Catherine Higgins, all my Estate, real and Personal, VIZ, Land, Negroes, Horses, Cattle, Hogs, Sheep etc., etc. Together with my Household and Kitchen furniture of every discription, during her Natural Life - She may Kill, or Sell, any of the Cattle, Horses, or Hogs for her Subsistance and maintenance, as She may Judge proper, or Equitable - And after her Death, I will that every of the Remaining Property, that she Dies Possessed of, be Equally Divided (Share and Share alike) amongst my Children, Or their Heirs -

LASTLY, I appoint, and ordain, by Beloved Sons, William Higgins, Abraham B. Higgins, and John O. Higgins Sole Executors, of this my Last Will and Testament. - In WITNESS whereof, I have hereunto Set my Hand, and Seal, this 10th Day of October, in the Year of our LORD, One thousand Eight hundred and Twenty, and of the Independence of the United-States of America the Forty fifth -
