I Benjamin Blanchard of the State South Carolina In Richland County do this 30th day of Jan-y 1788 make & ordain this my last will & Testament in manner & to the following - In the first Place I committ my soul to God Through the merits & mediation of Jesus Christ my only Savior- & my Body I commit to the Earth to be Buried at the descretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned -and as Touching such worldly Estate it hath Pleased God to bless me withall- I give & Desire the same in manner following - that is to say my will is that my funeal charge & all my Just debts be duly paid- Item I give & bequeath to my honourd Mother Mary Wimberley her maintainance out of my estate as long as she lives that is to say such as it will aford- Item I give & bequeath to my Brother Noah Wimberley a tract of Land being and lying in the State of Georgia in Washington County Containing 287 Acres on the North Side of the Oconey River granted to John Potts Item I give & Bequeath all the Rest of my land In this State above mentioned- & in the State of Georgia to be equally divided between my two sons Josiah & William Blanchard & all the Rest of my estate to be Equally divided between my two sons Josiah & William Blanchard & my Daughter Mary Blanchard Finally I do here by Nominate & appoint my trusty friend Noah Wimberley & John Bestick & my son Josiah Blanchard to be the whole & sole Executors of this my last will & testament
