To the Trinity Church in the Town of Columbia I give and bequeath five hundred dollars.

To Miss Ellen Russell of Lexington I give five hundred dollars and in case of her death before mine I desire the said money to be equally divided among the surviving children of her daughter Mrs Mary Addison.

To my half niece Mrs Mary Sullivan of Charleston I give Two Hundred dollars.

To my Grandchildren Ade and Mary Fisher Hampton I give Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars each to my other grandchildren the children of my late daughter ann. I give one thousand Five Hundred dollars each.

To my grandchildren the children of my late Son Paul I give one Thousand Five Hundred Dollars each.

To my grandchildren the children of my daughter Catherine I give one Thousand five hundred Dollars each.

To my Grand children, the children of my late my late son Christopher whom I have already provided for in another way. I give and bequeath the sum of one hundred dollars each, to purchase a watch or some other token in remembrance of me.

These Legacies I wish paid over to the persons properly authorized to receive them, within one year after my death To such of my grandchildren as may have come of age or married I desire the money to be paid directly for the other I wish my Executors to invest it in good bank stock and then for the certificates thereof of their respective guardians to be held in trust for them.

All the remainder of my property of which I may die possessed or having a right to, after deducting these Legacies, I give and bequeath to my only surviving child, my daughter Catherine E.

Hammond and her heirs after her.

And of this my last will and testament I appoint my Sons-in-law,
Wade Hampton and James H. Hammond the Executors.-
