CHARLOTTE BOWERS.

I Charlotte Bowers, of the Town of Columbia, in the State of South Carolina, being of sound and disposing mind and memour, but weak in body, and calling to mind the uncertainty of life, and being desirous to dispose of the worldly Estate which it hath pleased God to bless me with, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, in Manner following, that is to say; I desire, that should my daughter Hannah Bowers die in her infancy, or without marrying and leaving Heirs of her body; then and in that case I desire, that my negro girl Harriet, should be the property of my Friend Mrs. Sarah Flemming, the Wife of James Fleming, the wife of James Flemming, and of her Heirs; and in the said Event, of my said daughters death--happening under said circumstances, I give to my said Friend Mrs. Fleming the said negro girl named Harriet together with her future issue and increase--Also a Lot of Nine Acres or upwards of Land lying on the South Side of the Rokey Branch, being the same conveyed by the Rev. W. B. Johnson to my late Husband Adam Boers, under the same circumstances that I give the negro -girl---

I do nominate, constitute and appoint My Friend, the said James Fleming Executor, of this my last Will and Testament, Also I appoint him Guardian of the Person and property of said daughter Hannah--

Given under my hand and Seal this fifth day of February Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and Forty-- eight
