Item: My Will and desire is that all my Just Debts be paid

Item. I lend to my beloved Wife Mary Williamson all my Estate both Real and personal for and during her natural

Life and to be entirely at her own Controul without accounting for the use of the same, and after her Death to her Grand Daughter Mary Eliza Timmerman, to her and her Heirs forever.

Lastly I do hereby appoint my beloved Wife Mary Williamson Executrix and my Friend Ainsley Hall Executor of this my last Will and Testament-- In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and affix my Seal at Columbia this twenty third Day of October Anno Dom. one thousand eight hundred and twenty two.
